

## Setting up a Padlet




- 1. Go to padlet.com and log in.
- On the left side of the screen click on "Make a Padlet".
- Choose which style of Padlet you want to make.(see more on this later)
- Choose "wall" for right now.



- On the right side of the screen you will see a panel where you can now modify your Padlet.
- Change the Padlet name, add a description, and choose the wallpaper (background), color scheme, and fonts.
- 7. Scrolling down in that menu panel you can also set-up filtering (I turn this on), and I usually put the newest post first (because beginners will think their post didn't actually post.)
- 8. I usually don't activate moderation but consider your users to decide.
